<p>International Education Fee (IEF) Scholarship</p>	<p>Students must be enrolled in degree or certificate programs & earning credit for an experience abroad. There is no minimum institutional GPA, but students must have an established institutional GPA at GSU and be in Good Academic Standing. The International Education Fee (IEF) Scholarship is a \$1,000 award and can be received for multiple study abroad programs in different terms. The International Access Scholarship includes two types of awards:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Need-based financial aid recipients are eligible for awards up to \$7,500 based on the length of their program ▪ First-generation college students (defined as neither your mother nor father graduated from a 4-year institution); this is a \$2,000 award. 	<p>May/Summer 2019: February 15th Fall 2019: May 15th Spring 2020: October 31st</p>

NSEP Boren Scholarship	For students studying non-western languages in non-traditional locations ; study abroad proposals for two or more semesters are strongly encouraged. The Boren Scholarships offer a special initiative for undergraduate STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) majors.
